Other comments or suggestions:

In the submitted thesis author is focusing on the processing and health benefits of matcha. Despite very interesting topic, overall impression of the work is rather weak. The thesis is not comprehensive and sometimes it was difficult to follow. I found some information redundant, at the same time, other important information was missing. The author used 63 references, however, the citation format is not uniform and is not in accordance with the required directive. On the other hand, I would like to emphasize that author has chosen suitable methods and fulfilled the aims of the thesis.

I have following comments:

The thesis lacks a list of abbreviations.

Latin names e.g. Camellia sinensis should be written in italics.

The work contains several typing errors which made some sentences difficult to understand e.g. "Otherwise, the irritation and coldness of matcha will cause excessive gastric acid secretion and induce the adverse effects of hypoglycaemia, which will cause palpitations, palpitation, weakness, dizziness, and dizziness. appear."

Another example: "Then use and dryer for further drying."

I miss the introductory paragraph in chapter 6 (Chemical composition and methods) describing which substances does author want to test, why, and how.

The author sometimes switches between active and passive tense even within a single paragraph.

e.g." Use steam or steam hot air to make the dry tea green... ... Fresh tea leaves are exposed to heat for about 10 to 15 minutes in a fixation process."

Despite the above-mentioned comments, I evaluate the bachelor's thesis positively and I suggest evaluation as "good".

Questions for thesis defence:

- 1) Is there any potential toxicity of epigallocatechin gallate (EGCG)? If yes, please state examples.
- 2) Please, describe the difference between caffeine absorption from matcha versus from coffee in time.
