The presented diploma thesis has significant shortcomings with regard to the formal processing and the content of the work. It would have been very helpful if the author regularly consulted the partial procedures of the work and did not leave the consultation until the very last minute. The author did not follow the instructions for preparing the diploma thesis despite the recommendation of the supervisor.

The diploma thesis does not follow the citation standard, there are even titles in the list of sources that the author does not cite in the text, see some selected below:

The structure of the thesis also does not meet the requirements, both in terms of chapter titles and the scope of individual chapters.

The methodology of the work is insufficient, the procedural steps should have been better explained. At the same time, one cannot agree with the author that she performed a statistical analysis. If the author had not confused terms, the content of the work would have been sufficient for a diploma thesis.

However, I appreciate author's approach and personal interest in the topic. That's why I recommend the work to be defended with an assessment – good.
