I remember the previous version of the text that did not pass. Petra Fialová made quite a lot of improvement into it and so I think the text currently meets the standards necessary for this type of thesis. It still has some flaws but is very different from the one that was submitted half a year ago.

I seriously doubt Peru was the source of 95% of cocaine in 80s as you state in your Introduction. Where did you find this number?

Why are some of the other countries in the region unsuccessful in lowering down coca cultivation? In some areas in Colombia there was a recent growth of production...
